Reading & Phonics

Reading will be based around our topic 'Land Ahoy' and will include a range of fiction and non-fiction books, these books link to our WOW Day trip.

Children will be working on phase 3-5 in phonics.

During phonic and reading lessons, children will be taught to blend to read and segment (break up) to spell.

Writing

Writing skills will continue to be taught in fun and exciting ways:

- Writing stories by becoming authors and illustrators.
- Writing in different forms such as letters, invitations, character and setting descriptions.
- We will be focusing on handwriting, making sure the children are following our school's three golden handwriting rules.

Maths

Children will build on key concepts:

- 2D and 3D shapes
- Reading, writing and ordering numbers to from 1 -100.
- Counting forwards and backwards
- Addition
- Subtraction

Children will be taught a range of methods and will be encouraged to choose resources to find and explain and prove their answers.

Science

Our science topic for this half term builds on our knowledge of everyday materials. As part of our topic link we will:

- Identify and compare the suitability of different materials for specific uses.
- Find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting, and stretching.

Explore the properties of each material.

Topic - Land Ahoy

As part of a broad and balanced curriculum, pupils will learn key skills in relation to their new topic this term. This topic will begin with memorable experience - a visit to Cromford Canal to take part in a boat ride down the River Derwent! In Science, we will make models of boats, using different materials and test their suitability. In Geography, we will learn about the seven continents and seven seas through the seven-continent song. All key reading, writing and number skills will be consolidated through topic work.

Music

Children will have the opportunity to play and listen to a wide range of musical instruments. They will sing sea shanties and will experiment with pitch and tempo.
