Our topic this half term is Heroes
Have a look at our exciting, fun learning

Reading & Phonics

Reading will be based around the new topic, 'Heroes' and include the reading and book talk around a range of fiction texts.

- Superkid
- Avocado Baby
- Three Ninja Pigs
- The Three Little Super Pigs

Key reading skills over this half term will be making predictions and independently applying their phonics knowledge. Please ask your child to share what they know about Pirate Predictor with you

Writing

The main focus of our writing this half term will be forming letters correctly and using their knowledge of GPC's to form sentences that are phonetically plausible.

Writing will be taught in a fun and engaging way, through the genres of a list, narratives and story descriptions.

Working on key skills such as letter formation and retelling known stories will really help your child this half term.

Maths

Children will be learning about numbers and comparing using the vocabulary more than, less than, and equal to.

Children will focus on learning the numbers up to 20, counting forwards and backwards, finding 1 more and 1 less and representing the numbers in different ways. Children will also be introduced to number bonds to 10.

Science

Our science topic for this half term is focused around animals, including humans. As part of our topic we will be:

- Learning to name the different parts of the body including arm, leg, hands, feet, knees, toes.
- Learning to recognise and name the ears, mouth, eyes, nose and head.
- Investigate our senses: touch, taste, smell, sight and hearing
- Perform a simple test.

PE

Through our P.E lessons we will be staying active and learning about how to keep fit this half term by:

- Learning how to throw correctly.
- Learning how to catch correctly.
- Participate in team games.

Computing

Computing continues to be an integral part of the curriculum and will be used across all subjects.

During computing lessons this term, we will be learning:

- What an algorithm
- What a program is
- Learn the importance of following an instruction in the correct order (computational thinking)

We will also continue to teach the importance E-safety in every lesson. We will be focusing on what personal information is and why it is important to keep it private.

RE

Children will be exploring the question 'Who is a Christian and what do they believe?'

Drawing upon and talking about their own beliefs children will be thinking about similarities and differences to their own religions.

PSHE

This term's learning will continue to build on promoting our knowledge surrounding relationships and wellbeing.

Children will also be learning about different feelings.

They will consider:

- How to manage their own feelings.
- All feelings are OK.
- How to respond to other peoples' emotions.

History

In year 1 we will be focusing on significant historical people, places and events. We will also be looking and significant individuals from the past and the present who have contributed to local and international achievements.

This term will be learning about:

- Meaning of words 'Past' and 'present'
- Florence Nightingale and why she **was** important
- The differences and similarities in nursing from past and present
- Greta Thunberg and why she **is** important.

Topic - Heroes

As part of a broad and balanced curriculum, pupils will learn key skills in relation to their new topic this term. This topic will begin with a WOW day where we will take part in a Superhero Boot Camp using our senses, testing our fitness and designing our own superhero costume. All areas of learning will encompass interactive activities, for example, designing and making, art and practical investigations during science. All key reading, writing and number skills will continue to be consolidated through topic work.

Music

In music we will learn about the different sounds our bodies and voices can make, and we will sing a range of songs linked to our topic. We will also learn what a rhythm and chants are in music. We will use each lesson to perform to help encourage confidence building.
